## HELP THE COMENG WORKERS FIGHT BACK

## PUT THE SQUEEZE ON ANI

Four hundred workers at Comeng (Granville, Sydney) are in the 12th week of a tough battle with their employer, Australian National Industries (ANI).

Comeng workers are determined to win — but they need your help to do it.

We appeal to fellow workers everywhere to place bans on ANI and its subsidiaries. This means refusing to handle:

COATES construction equipment KOMATSU MINING equipment STEEL MARK products ANI-SERGEANTS equipment CONTAINER CARE LTD

These bans have been approved by an ACTU-convened meeting of some 40 unions.

## WHY THE DISPUTE?

Twelve weeks ago ANI sacked 83 workers with no severance pay and only one hour's notice. The rest of the workers took industrial action and were stood down.

ANI then announced:

\*Wages cut by 10%

\*Disability payments cut

\*Workers re-classified down

\*Over award payments abolished if workers refuse to scab on their mates All this was done in the name of "re-structuring" despite the fact that Comeng had \$440 million worth of railway contracts which included guarantees of employment for the men. ANI has since backed down on some of these demands. But the workers are still fighting to defend jobs and keep their original classifications.

## THE COMENG FIGHT IS YOUR FIGHT

What is happening at Comeng is not an isolated event — it is a sign of things to come. If they get away with cutting wages and conditions at Comeng other employers will jump on the bandwagon.
