Educational opportunities are scanty, the increased money spent on armaments means less on education and culture.

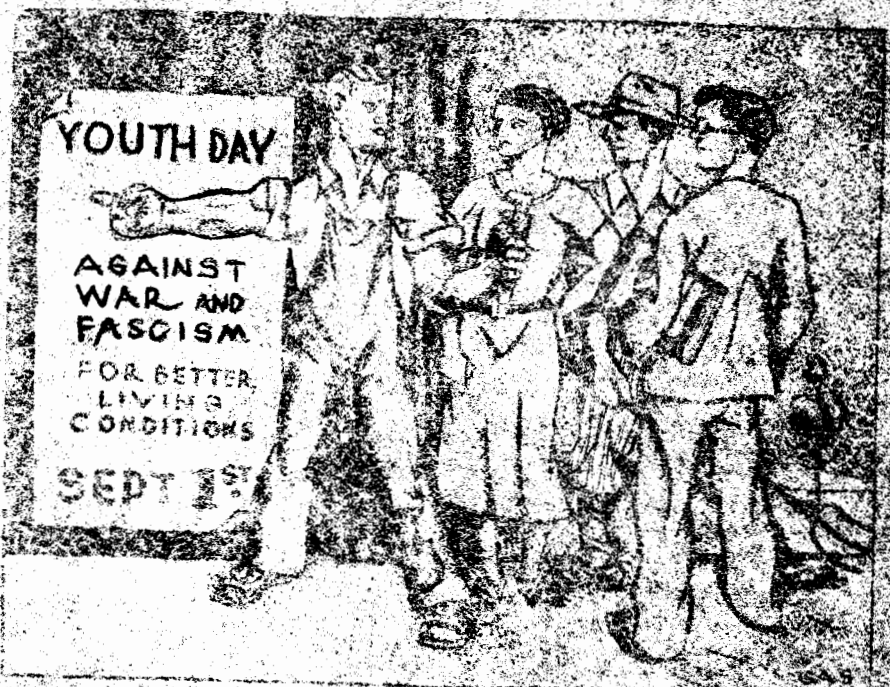
Sport, our natural right, is so costly that it is barred to many.
