The Society also provides speakers for labour and trade union meetings and undertakes research on matters of industrial and political importance.

The Fabian Society of Queensland enjoys a high reputation and is anxious to maintain it. It offers unlimited opportunities to members to help in carrying out its important educational work, and to assist in the running of the Society.
