### RELAXED WAGE PEGS BIG WIN FOR STRIKERS

Already the metal trades strikers have won a major victory for the working class by forcing the lifting of ware pegring regulations.

Until the Amalgamated Engineers Union extended its strike the Ghiffey Government had refused all demands, even from the ACTU and the NSW Labor Party executive, for lifting these regulations.


