To prevent any inconvenience either to the Government or to the mercantile interest by this abrupt suspension of the line, the directors have consented to despatch the Propontis on the 14th inst., from Southampton, and the voyage of one to be made to the Cape of Good Hope and Indian Ports. The subsidy received by this Company for the Cape and Indian service has amounted to about 3s. 5d. per mile. PROGRESS OF THE MORMONS.

We extract from the Times the following account of the religious worship of the English Mormons:

"It appears that at the end of about three years after Smith's announcement of himself as a prophet, about 30 persons were convinced of the reality of his pretensions, and from this time forward converts rapidly increased. Smith removed to Kirtland, in Ohio, and set up a mill, a store, and a bank.

"It was not without opposition that this progress was effected. As appears to be usual upon the rise of new religious seets, the Mormons were accused of holding many outrageous and immoral destrines, and among them, that of a community of wives. The popular hostility was often violently manifested, and the saints were subjected to much ill-treatment. Smith himself in 1832 was tarred and feathered by a midnight mob; and in the following year the whole of the Mormons in Missouri (amounting to above 1000 persons) were expelled from Independence, Jackson county, which had been described by Smith as the Zion appointed by revelation for the resting-place of the saints. They removed to Clay county, where, in 1837, they were joined by the prophet himself, whose bank in Kirtland had failed. Meantime, the prejudice against the Mormons followed them to their new habitation, and, in 1838, after several sanguinary outbreaks, Joseph Smith and his brother Hyrum were imprisoned, and the whole community of Mormons were expelled from their possessions in Missouri. They took refuge in the neighbouring state of Illinois, Here, in 1839, their prophet, who had managed to escape from prison, joined them. They now numbered 15,000 souls.

"In Illinois they close the village of Commerce as their residence, which soon became converted into a

"In Illinois they chose the village of Commerce as "In Illinois they close the village of Commerca as their residence, which soon became converted into a considerable town, of which the Prophet was appointed Mayor. This town they called Nauvoo, or "Beautiful," according to the language of the Book of Mormon. A bedy of militia, called the Nauvoo Legion, was established, Smith being 'General.' In 1841 a 'revelation' ordered the construction of a splendid temple, towards which chieve all the spite were to contribute.

tion' ordered the construction of a splendid temple, towards which object all the saints were to contribute a full title of their possessions. It is said that they expended on this structure nearly 1,000,000 dollars.

"In Nauvoo the Mormons seem to have increased and prospered greatly; the town extended fast; the temple gradually rose, and the Prophet was the absolute head of a comparatively powerful community, which hardly recognised the ordinary laws of the State. In 1843 he became a candidate for the Presidency, and put forth a statement of his views. In 1844, however, occurred the final catastrophe of his life. A Nauvoo paper, having printed certain scandal life. The former was the carliest associate of Smith, and professed to be acquainted with all his secrets; but, as the prominent advocate of 'the spiritual wife' doctrine, he was looked upon with disfavor as the virtual author of much of the suspicion and hostility with which the Mormons were regarded. Brigham Young succeeded, therefore, to the post of 'Prophet,' (which he still retains) and Rigdon was expelled from the community. An interval of scarcely interrupted progress followed, daring which the temple was completed; but in 1845 the troubles were renewed; perpetual conflicts, in which blood was shed, occurred, and the city of Nauvoo itself was regularly besieged. At length the Mormons, conscious of their inability alone to cope with their antagonists, and seeing that no confidence could be reposed upon the law for their protection, undertook (since nothing less would satisfy their enemies) that they would altogether quit the State—mies) that they would altogether quit the State—

In the last mumber of R Tek o od s Magazine we is a very commuting article, under the above title. Comforting we say, for it always comferts us to be told that whatever, we love is good for us, and to have our tastes endorsed by the judgement of sound advisers. The article we speak of lays down the following prop sitions: The tens, coffees and eocoas we infuse, derive their esteemed aroma from a chemical substance produced in them during drying and roasting. They all contain theine -a slightly bitter principle, which is very rich in nitrogen. This peculiar nitrogencontaining principle, when taken into the system, lessens lessens the natural wear and tear of the body, and this to a certain extent, saves food. Of these propositions the first has been settled by repeated observations.
The second is also settled by chemical analysis. As to the third, if it is not true, we must keep on preaching abstinence and practising as far as we can coax ourselves will we grudge the silver the blessed theine
