

Alexandria, October 17th .- To day we have news from Constantinople. The Allies had offered the Russians battle at Bellbecon, on the Crimea, which had been refused, and the Russians had taken refuge within the walls of Schastopol.

The Artificity of the Adies were in a position to hombard Schastopol, but had given the Russians forty-eight hours to reply to the demand to surrender.

Malta, October 18 .- The latest news from Schastopol is that the bombardment had commenced, and it is expected that the town and forts would be in the possession of the allies in forty-eight hours. Nine thousand marines had been landed and a large number of guns. The forts




